3 Day / 3 Night Trip ~ 4 person minimum, 20 person maximum.

If we are lucky, we might bump into a few of the ranch's legendary Longhorn herd grazing on open rangeland little changed since the Texas cattle drive era. All this and more!

Your guides are all local professional wranglers who know and understand the area's history, flora, and fauna. All are certified in Wilderness Advanced First Aid and many are bi-lingual. They might also tell a few tales about the lore of the Big Bend, some true, some.... Quien sabe?

Sample itinerary only:

Day 1: We'll meet you for dinner at the Saucedo Lodge Bunkhouse Dining Hall. After dinner we'll go over the horse orientation and follow that up with activities around the campfire and tales of the Big Bend.

Day 2: Ride around Leyva Canyon to Los Baños to visit an ancient Indian encampment, and then circle back to Saucedo for dinner, campfire and entertainment.

Day 3: Ride up to the base of Oso Mountain – the highest point in the Park at 5,135 feet – where you will have the best views of the Solitario. Afterward, we'll make our way back to Agua Adentro for a chuck wagon farewell dinner.
